## PROFILE OF THE COLLEGE



Ganesh Lal Choudhury College was established at the heart of the Barpeta Road town as a co-educational institution in 1990. The foundation stone of the college building was laid on 16th March, 1990, by Sri Ashok Saikia, the then Education Commissioner, Govt. Of Assam.

The college took its birth with the generous donation of Rs. 10,00,000/- (Rupees Ten Lakh only) by a prominent citizen of Barpeta Road, Aranyak, Late Mohan Lal Choudhury, in the name of his elder brother Late Ganesh Lal Choudhury. As such, the institution bears the name Ganesh Lal Choudhury College. Barpeta Road is one of the biggest commercial towns in Lower Assam. The area has an age old reputation for its cultural and socio-economic factors. Its business and farmer populace had faced great problem in acquiring higher education till then, as there was no institution for higher education in Barpeta Road and Gobardhana Block. Youths aspiring for higher education had to go out of the area, most of whom belonged to agro-based farmers and were economically handicapped. So, a group of enterprising educationists and social workers of Barpeta Road came forward and founded Ganesh Lal Choudhury College. Apart from the donation mentioned, the college has been carrying on its various developmental works through public collections, aids from local M.P.'s and M.L.A.'s LAD Fund etc. Ganesh Lal Choudhury College is now under 2 (f) and 12 (B) recognition of UGC as per UGC Act of 1956. The University Grant Commission has sanctioned Rs. 70,00,000/- (Rupees Seventy Lakh only) and Rs. 60,00,000/- (Rupees Sixty Lakh only) for the construction of Indoor Stadium and Women's Hostel respectively under the XII th plan period and both the constructions have already completed. The College has been the opportunity to receive a grant from the UGC worth Rs. 10,00,000/- (Ten Lakhs) under XII plan for purchasing library equipments, books and journals. Another Rs. 10,00,000/- (Ten Lakhs) was sanction by UGC for purchasing sports infactures. Womens' hostel facility is provided to meritorious girl students from academic session 2016-17. The mission of the college is to remove the educational backwardness of the area, provide accessibility of higher education, give a standing to social needs and relevant assistance to the people of Barpeta Road.

Late Dr. Kamal Narayan Das, was the founder Principal. The college introduced H. S. And B.A. Classes (Arts stream) simultaneously in 1990. G.L. Choudhury College was accorded affiliation by the university of Gauhati in 1997. The medium of instruction is Assamese and English. At present Mr. Jagannath Barman, the seniormost Asst. Professor is the Principal-in-charge of the College.



## VISION AND MISSION

Ganesh Lal Choudhury College has evolved with the intention of creating an environment where one can learn to enquire, to observe oneself and relate to the earth. It is imperative therefore, that parents and students understand and appreciate the intention of the college and actively participate in this movement.

## LOCATION & HOW TO REACH

Barpeta Road, a Commercial town is situated in the Western part of Assam with a Geographical coordinates of  $26^{\circ} 30' N$  latitude and  $90^{\circ} 50'$  longitude. The town is 165 ft.(50mtr.) above the sea level and lies beside NH-31. The town is at a distance of 135km from Guwahati by Roadways and 128 km by Railway which can be covered in 2-3 hrs. The nearest Airport is Lokopriya Gopinath Bordoloi International Airport, Borjhar, Guwhati at distance of 135 km. The town is well connected through regular buses and trains to all part of the country. The town is at a distance of 21 km from the district head quarter of Barpeta District and 9 km from Barnagar Sub-Division. The town is the gateway of Manas National Park, the World Heritage Site. The town is referred to be the commercial capital of Western Assam

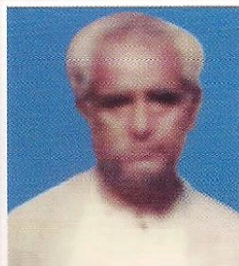

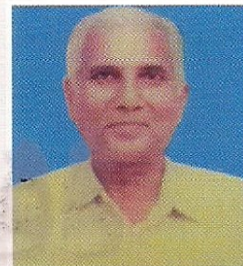

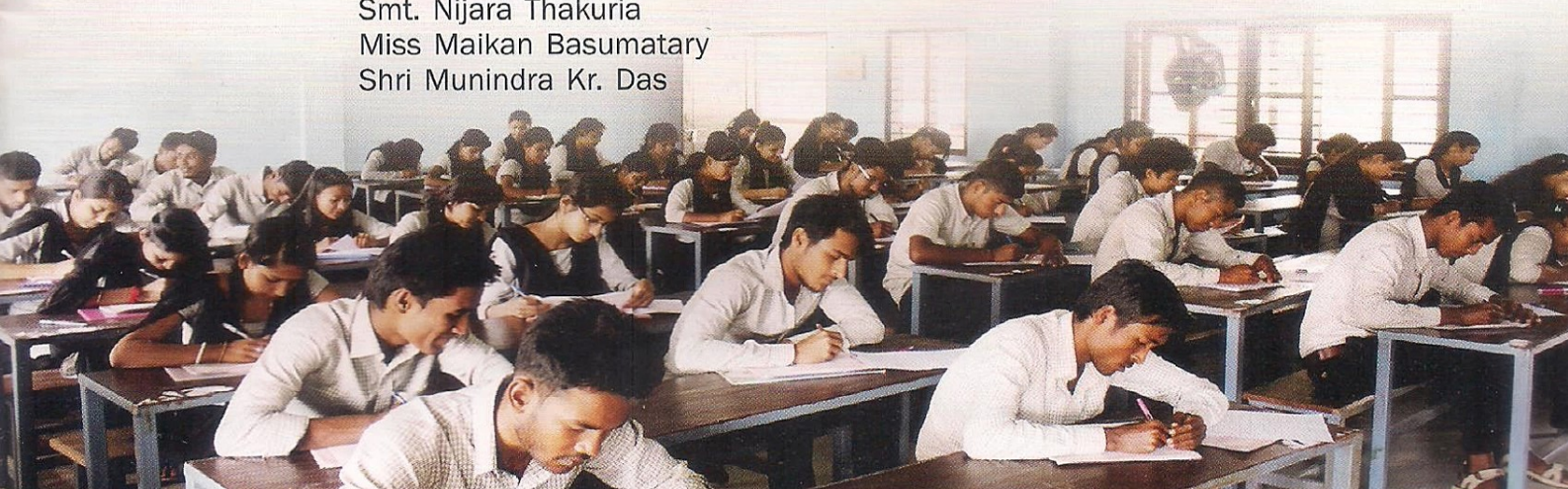

## ADMISSION PROCEDURE

### Issue of Application Form

Candidates seeking admission in H.S & B.A. Classes of G.L. Choudhury College have to obtain Admission Forms and Prospectus from the college office against a payment of Rs. 100/- (One Hundred)

### Submission of Application Form

- Admission Forms should be submitted according to the date notified by the authority from the date of issue of forms.
- Application Form, completed in all respects, must be submitted to the college office during college hours. No Application Form will be accepted after last date of submission.
- Application Form must be submitted along with xerox copies of Marksheet and Certificate of the last Qualifying Examination and caste certificate, wherever necessary.

### Admission will be strictly on the basis of merit

The Merit list will be put up on the College Notice Board. The merit list is strictly provisional. No candidate can claim for admission just on the ground that his/her application has been accepted and his/her name appears in the merit list. The selected candidate must get admitted on the day of admission. Admission is governed by the college admission rules. Decision of the admission committee regarding admission is final.

### Selection Criteria

- 1) Cut of marks for issuing forms in both H.S. And Degree classes is 40%.
- 2) Students from schools adopted by the college under the Organic Linkage Scheme, Govt. Of Assam would be given preference.
- 3) Students with Extra-curricular activities would be given preference.
- 4) Orientation programme for students would be held on the 1st day of the Session.
- 5) Free admission will be given to the students securing 80%. and above marks in SEBA/AHSEC.
- 6) Students having gap year will have to produce a gap certificate from the competent authority such as judicial affidavit/gazetted officer/ medical officer. Gap exceeding one year will not be considered for admission.
- 7) Reservation of seats : As per the Govt. of Assam reservation policy, seats are reserved for OBC/MOBC/SC/ST(P), categories.
- 8) 3% of the total seats will be kept reserved for differently able persons as per Govt. of Assam norms. But they should produce appropriate certificate issued by the competent authority.

### Students are required to produce the following documents at the time of admission.

- a) Original Marksheet of the last qualifying examination.
- b) The original certificate from the head of the institution last attended.
- c) Students passing the qualifying examination earlier to the current year must submit a gap certificate testifying their activities during the last year.
- d) Three copies of passport size colour photographs.
- e) Original Registration certificate of HSLC in case of HS class and HS Registration certificate in case of TDC classes
- f) Original Caste Certificate.



## GENERAL RULES FOR MAINTENANCE OF DISCIPLINE IN COLLEGE

- A. i) The college is committed to the maintenance of discipline and decorum among students.
- ii) Students must abide by all rules and regulations as prescribed by the college authorities. Violations of rules, irregular attendance, irregular clearance of dues, showing discourtesy to teacher and staff members in any forms, adoption of unfair means during examination, delinquent behaviour in the college campus or outside etc. are some of the offences which may invite disciplinary action like termination of scholarship, forced transfer and even expulsion from the college.
- iii) Ragging in college campus is strictly prohibited. Strong disciplinary action will be taken if one is found to be involved directly or indirectly in ragging.
- iv) Any notice desired to be pasted or circulated by the students anywhere in the college premises will need the prior permission of the college authority.
- v) Maintenance of discipline is vested with the Head of the Institution. His/Her decision shall be final in all such matters.
- vi) Use of Four wheelers, Motor Bikes and Mobile phones by the students in the college campus are strictly prohibited.

### B. Attendance Rules :

HS Course : Students not attending at least 75% of the classes held will not be allowed to appear in the Test Examination.

B.A. Course : Students should attend at least 75% of the classes held.

Students who fail to attend their classes over a certain period of time at a stretch on genuine grounds, such as, serious diseases or accidents and related treatment involving themselves and members of the family, death of the near and dear ones, academic / sport / NCC / cultural activities etc. as approved by the college must apply in writing to the Head of Department concerned for consideration of the absence in the period - immediately after such absence. Application must be supported by testimonials / documents wherever necessary. Even for such cases, the actual attendance must not fall short of 50%.

### C. Identity Card :

College Identity Cards are issued annually. Old Identity Card is to be renewed at the beginning of each academic session.

The College authority reserves the right to issue a duplicate Identity Card in case of loss/damage of the original one.

### D. Students' Uniform :

Each student of the college must attend the classes in their uniform. The colour combination of the College Uniform is given below :

a) **For Boys:** **Shirt-** Olive Green checks in off- white base  
**Pant-** Black, **Sweater-** Olive Green

b) **For Girls:** **Kameez-** Olive Green checks in off-white base

## G.L. CHOUDHURY COLLEGE STUDENTS' UNION:

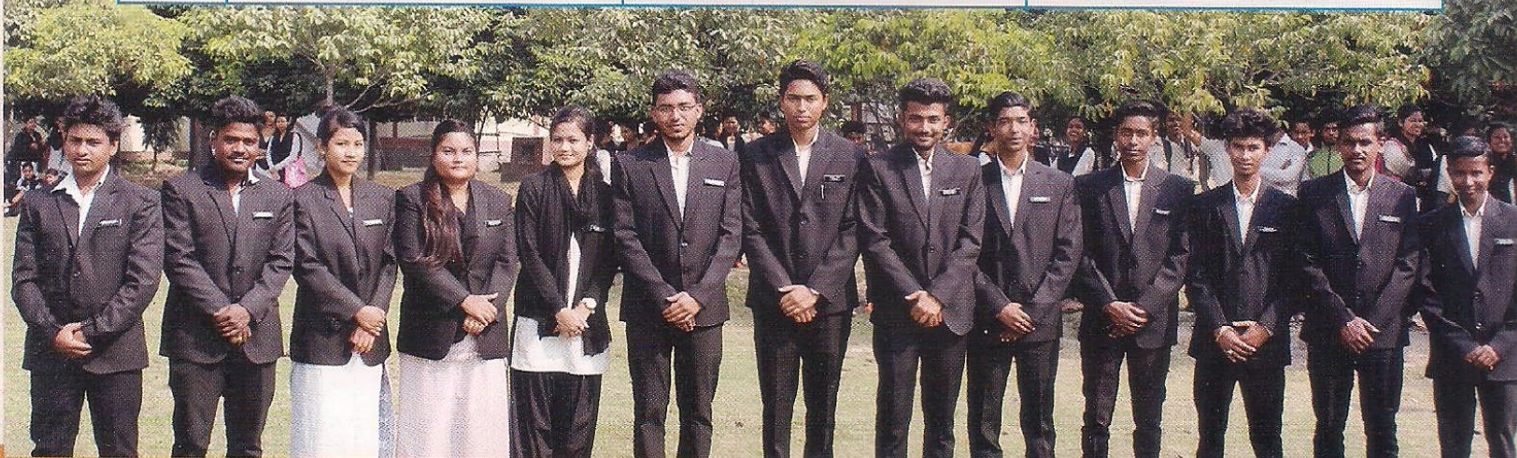

## MOHAN LAL CHOUDHURY LIBRARY :

### Library :

G.L. Choudhury College Library is a well stocked and well-equipped Library of its kind. The library is renamed as "Mohanlal Choudhury Library" on 28<sup>th</sup> January, 2015. The library acquired the N-List membership for more than 100000 E-books and 6000+ E- journals free of cost. A well-furnished reading room for both boys and girls is adjacent to the library. Moreover, Internet connectivity and Wi-Fi facility are provided. The SOUL 2.0 Software is installed in the library computer for automation. Moreover the library will soon put its circulation and membership work on SOUL 2.0 to increase the efficiency and reduce the lethargic operation of cataloguing work.

### Library Collection :

The library has a rich collection of Textbooks and references covering a wide range of subjects. The Library also subscribes journals, popular magazines and various newspapers regional as well as national.

- i) The library is kept open from 10.00 A.M. To 04.00 P.M. on working days.
- ii) Only registered members are allowed to avail the library facilities.
- iii) On entry, members are required to produce Identity Card issued by the college authority.
- iv) Students can borrow books against their Library Cards. Books are normally issued for a period of 10 days. After the stipulated time period @Re. 1/- per day will be charged.
- v) Library Cards are not transferable. Borrowers are responsible for the book(s) issued against 'Library Card' if lost.
- vi) Students should not write in, mark or otherwise disfigure, damage books, furniture etc. In case of such damage the cost of the articles shall be paid by the member.
- vii) Readers should observe "STRICT SILENCE" in the Library Reading Room.



## Facilities

### Book Bank Facility :

The Library provides Book Bank facilities to the students for the entire duration of a semester belonging to BPL without any charge. Only two books shall be issued to a student. Students shall be responsible for any loss/damage of books and have to replace books by new ones.

### Photo copying Facility :

The library provides photo copying facility to the Faculty Members and students at subsidized rates.

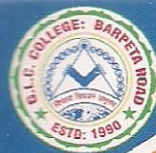
1. There will be six semesters covering 03 years.
